Where is the British Indian Ocean territory located?

The British Indian Ocean Territory is located about 750 km south of the Maldives and 1700 km south of India in the middle of the Indian Ocean. It was founded by the British government in 1965.

Does the British Indian Ocean territory have a tropical climate?

In the British Indian Ocean Territory, as in all equatorial countries, there is a tropical climate. Unlike in Europe or the USA, there is almost no difference between the seasons. The daylight hours vary little, and the temperature differences between summer and winter are also lower.

How many islands are in the British Indian Ocean territory?

The countrywide time in the British Indian Ocean Territory is Indian Chagos Time (ICT), which is currently 14 hours ahead of Los Angeles. As in many countries, there is no daylight savings time in the British Indian Ocean Territory. Related to Greenwich Mean Time, there's the same difference of 6 hours all over the year.

Established as a territory of the UK in 1965, a number of the British Indian Ocean Territory (BIOT) islands were transferred to the Seychelles when it attained independence in 1976. Subsequently, BIOT has consisted



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only of the six main island groups comprising the Chagos Archipelago.



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
