Can you put food in a plastic container?

The Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics in the US, the world's largest organisation of food and nutrition professionals, advises consumers to only use plastic containers to store cold food. Most plastic food containers have a triangle on the bottom containing a number from one to seven, which identifies the type of plastic used to make it.

Throw away old containers. Using a new, safer container would be preferable instead of an old, cracked, or discolored plastic one. You may lessen your exposure to hazardous chemicals and microwave-safely reheat food in plastic containers by heeding the advice in this article.
