What is the largest Battery Park in Europe?

It is also the largest battery park in Continental Europe. It has been labeled the 'Baltic Storage Platform' as the park, which is in Kiisa near Tallinn, is aimed at integrating Estonian, Latvian and Lithuanian grids with other European grids by the end of 2025 when the first half of the park is due to be built. The second half is slated for 2026.

Can Eesti Energia build a large-scale energy storage facility?

Eesti Energia was unable to secure a contract for a large-scale energy storage facility through an international tender. It is expected that it would have a capacity ranging from 25 to 50 megawatt-hours that sufficiently meets the reserve needs of the Baltic countries.

Can peat be used for EV batteries?

However, Reuters reported in 2021 about an Estonian research study into using peat for building sodium-ion batteries. These batteries, according to researchers, are cheaper than lithium-ion batteries, and can be used along-side lithium-ion to bring down the cost of batteries for EVs and other needs.

For example, a 5 kWh battery system has an approximate payback period of five years, while a 15 kWh system has an approximate payback period of eight years. The Foresight Centre states in their recent short report "Electricity Storage Prospects in Households" that home battery storage could serve the interests of the entire electricity system.
