Will Kosovo build a battery energy storage system?

The government of Kosovo will build a battery energy storage system (BESS) with a capacity of 200MWh-plus to deal with the energy crisis.

Who owns the energy facilities in Kosovo?

Kosovo\* will own the facilities, the ministry added. Economy minister Artane Rizvanolli said the program would back the independence of the national energy system and enable its transformation. The details will be made known after negotiations between the government and MCC, planned for May.

How will Kosovo's Energy System work?

The system will stabilize the fluctuating frequency of electricity, store energy in the early hours of the morning when consumption is low, and connect with solar, wind, or similar power plants. Kosovo\* will own the facilities, the ministry added.

How much battery capacity will Kosovo have by 2031?

Kosovo\* intends to launch market-based reserve services and reach at least 170 MW of flexible regulation capacity by 2031. The size of batteries in storage facilities planned to be completed by the end of the period is 170 MW, with an overall two-hour capacity, translating to 340 MWh.

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The Government of Kosovo\* is preparing a series of auctions for renewable energy and battery storage capacity. Minister of Economy Artane Rizvanolli revealed plans for auctioning 950 MW in the next two years, in line with the energy strategy until 2031.

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In July 2022, MCC and the Government of Kosovo signed a new \$202 million Compact. The Kosovo Compact will support three projects focused on addressing Kosovo's unreliable supply of electricity and will assist Kosovo in transitioning towards an energy future that is more sustainable, inclusive, reliable, and affordable.

The compact program for a grant to Kosovo\*, estimated at USD 234 million, consists of two projects: batteries with an installed capacity of 200 MWh, and the development of the workforce and involvement of women in the energy sector, the Ministry of Economy said.



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
