What is Myanmar's first wind power project?

A deal for Myanmar's first wind power project with the participation of a Chinese energy infrastructure company was signed on Wednesday, a major step in bilateral new-energy cooperation, the Chinese Embassy in Myanmar said in a statement released on Thursday.

Will China and Myanmar work together on a wind power project?

China and Myanmar will reportedly work together on a wind power project in the Arakan State townships of Ann, Thandwe and Gwa.

Is Myanmar suitable for wind energy?

Myanmar has many hilly, rural areas and more than 2,800 kilometres of coastline suitable for harnessing wind power. However, the Renewable Energy Association Myanmar (REAM) expresses little hope that the government will support wind energy projects, stating that there are several reasons why investors are reluctant to take risks on Myanmar renewable energy projects.

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Ann Wind Farm is a 150MW onshore wind power project. It is planned in Rakhine, Myanmar. According to GlobalData, who tracks and profiles over 170,000 power plants worldwide, the project is currently at the permitting stage.
