

How much solar energy does Portugal produce?

In a bold announcement, Portugal recently surpassed its entire solar output from 2023 by September 2024, celebrating a record year for solar energy production. According to REN (Rede de Energia Nacional), the country generated more than 3.99 TWh of solar energy in just the first nine months, exceeding last year's total of 3.6 TWh.

What is the largest solar power plant in Portugal?

On 9 October 2021, the largest solar power plant in Portugal was inaugurated in Alcútem. With an installed capacity of 219 MW, the power plant has 661,500 solar panels and can power the needs of 200,000 homes. It occupies an area of 320 hectares and will prevent the emission of 326,000 tons of carbon dioxide every year.

How much solar power does Portugal have in 2022?

Portugal's cumulative PV capacity hit 2.59 GW at the end of 2022, outpacing the growth of other renewable energy sources. The latest statistics from Portugal's Directorate General for Energy and Geology (DGEG) also show that the country added just 118 MW of new solar capacity in the first four months of 2023.

What is Portugal's commitment to photovoltaic energy?

Portugal's commitment, as underscored by Decree-Law No. 162/2019, facilitates the adoption of PV technology, allowing residents and businesses alike to tap into the sun's inexhaustible energy. Why Photovoltaic Energy? This innovative approach to energy generation is about transforming how we consume energy.

How much money did the Portuguese spend on solar panels?

Of this amount, 69.7 million euros were spent by the Portuguese on solar panels, 51.3 million on heat pumps and 45.8 million on efficient windows. Now, the Government has decided to change the rules of the game.

How can Portugal meet growing energy demands in a sustainable way?

Meanwhile, the rapid expansion of hydroelectric and solar energy capacity is helping Portugal meet growing energy demands in a sustainable way. These efforts align with European Union objectives, such as the RePowerEU plan and the Renewable Energy Directive, which targets 42.5% renewable energy in total consumption by 2030.

Portugal's record of 50% from wind and solar comes despite relatively modest wind generation. Strong deployment of solar capacity pushed solar generation to an all-time high of 360 GWh in April, significantly higher than the previous record of ...

Portugal is intensifying its commitment to renewable energy with the announcement of new incentives aimed at promoting solar panel installations and enhancing window efficiency in residential properties.

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Already this year, the program subsidies for solar panels do not go beyond 1,000 euros for applications from Lisbon or Porto, without energy storage systems. For the remaining regions, the support is increased by 10% and can grow up to 1,100 euros.

The panels are raised 2 meters off the ground thus allowing grazing to continue. The plant provides enough energy for 8,000 homes and saves an estimated 30,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions per year.
