Syria Essential Services II (SES II) is a four-year, program funded by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and implemented by Blumont Engineering Solutions in partnership with local Syrian communities. It is designed to stabilize conflict-affected communities through two overlapping and complementary objectives:
