

Is Madagascar ready for solar power?

With all regions of Madagascar enjoying over 2,800 hours of sunlight per year, the Grande Ile is the perfect location for development of solar power, with a potential capacity of 2,000 kWh/m²/year. The Government is counting on this potential to fulfill its objective of providing energy access to 70% of Malagasy households by 2030.

What is Scaling Solar in Madagascar?

Madagascar is currently the fifth country in Africa in which a Scaling Solar tender process was launched, after two tender processes in Zambia, one in Senegal, and another in Ethiopia. It is also the first Scaling Solar project to include solar energy storage requirements by pairing solar with batteries.

Does Madagascar have an energy transition?

Madagascar has not yet completed its demographic transition and will have to ensure effective planning and management of its energy transition. The access to electricity is particularly dichotomous between rural region and main urban areas such as Antananarivo, Diego, Majunga.

What type of Hydropower is used in Madagascar?

Large-scale hydropower. The exploitation of Madagascar's hydropower resource is made up of two types of hydropower plants: large-scale hydropower plants with an installed capacity of more than 25 MW and small-scale of hydropower plants with under 25 MW size of installed power, with two plants options namely storage capacity and run-of-river.

This paper focuses on the potential of renewable energy sources (RES) for electricity generation in Madagascar which is a lower-income country. A large accessibility to electricity could be a driving force for the economic development of this fourth worldwide Island.

Three large-scale heavy fuel oil (HFO) plants in Madagascar are being hybridised with solar PV thanks to a USD 6 million bridge loan from REPP to develop Lidera Green Power (Lidera). Currently, 75% of the country's power is generated from expensive and high-emission HFO and diesel plants, but the government is keen to reduce dependence on ...
